OVERVIEW

- The 2012-13 WSOP Circuit Event tour will use a Cumulative Player Point System to track player success in all official WSOP Circuit open gold ring events. (12 per stop; 240 overall)
- Players earn points at each WSOP Circuit stop.
- You must cash in an official WSOP ring event to earn points.
- All buy-ins for official preliminary ring events (from $\$ 300-\$ 1,000$ buy-in) award points in the same manner.
- All buy-ins for official Main Event (\$1,500 level) award points differently and higher than preliminary ring events.


## QUALIFICATION DETAILS

There are 4 different ways to qualify for the WSOP National Championship. They are:

1. Automatic: Win the $\$ 1,500$ Main Event at any WSOP Circuit event. (1 per stop; 20 players total)
2. Automatic: Be the "Casino Champion" accumulating the most points at any of the individual WSOP Circuit stops' 12 official "ring" events. (1 per stop; 20 players total)
3. Accumulate Points: Accumulate enough points between all the WSOP Circuit stops to be positioned in the Top 60 cumulative point standings at the end of the 2012-13 WSOP Circuit tour.
4. Buy-In: Be one of the top 100 players in the "WSOP POY World Rankings" and have the chance to buy-into the event for $\$ 10,000$ a seat. The World Rankings will recognize cumulative performance in open events at the World Series of Poker and World Series of Poker Europe over a two-year period and be released in November, 2012.
